

30. Food shall not be carried or given to a dog under test.
31. All offers of sponsorship or donation must be included in printed material with the names of the sponsors.
32. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the canine press whenever possible.
33. All dogs are exhibited at the Show at the owner's risk. The Club will not be responsible for any loss, damage or errors arising from any cause whatsoever.
34. The use of clickers and squeaky toys within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
35. Nothing may be carried, worn or displayed by a handler or a dog during judging which is capable of indicating the identity of the dog or owner, nor must anything be said or any action taken which identifies the dog other than by exhibit number which must be worn whilst competing.
36. In the event of any cheque or money order not being honoured when first presented to the Bank, the exhibitor shall be held liable for any Bank charges or fees incurred. If the entry fee and such charges are not paid immediately upon request the exhibitor will be reported to the Kennel Club and will be dealt with by the Kennel Club Committee.
37. The only proof of posting of entry acceptable to the Committee is a 'Certificate of Posting' issues by the Post Office.
38. In the unforeseen event of show cancellation due to no fault of the Committee, all monies will be returned less expenses. Applications for refund should be accompanied by a stamped self-addressed envelope.
39. Covert filming/videoing within the precincts of the show is strictly forbidden.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

1. In the following Definitions of Classes First Prize wins in Limited and Sanction Show Obedience Classes and Open Shows confined to one breed do not count for entry in Open and Championship Obedience Classes.
2. A dog must be entered in the lowest class for which it is eligible and may also be entered in another class if desired, one special class excepted, with the exception of Championship Class C for only dogs qualified may be entered. (Note the qualification for Championship Class C and Obedience Warrant). Obedience Champions are only eligible to compete in Class C at Open and Championship Shows.
3. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. Monday 19 May 2008

REGULATIONS - The Show will be held under Kennel Club Regulations for Tests for Obedience
SHOW REGULATIONS

- Dogs entered at K.C. licensed Obedience Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with KC regulations for Classification and Registration B.
- The show will open at 8.00am and judging will begin at 9.00am.
- In classes without a full running order dogs will be received until 10.00am after which no dogs may be received except under unforeseen and exceptional circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management
 - Where dogs are entered solely in classes with a full running order (11 and 12) they will be received at any time, except that in Championship Class C this must not be later than 12.00noon. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- The show will close 30 minutes after all classes have ended.
- Entry fees are £4.50 per dog CLASSES 1 – 10 inclusive, £5.50 per dog CLASSES 11 & 12, Catalogue £2.50 with entries NFC free.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- Animals Allowed in Show. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of a Dog Show during its continuance, except any dog registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes, or by permission of the General Committee
- Puppies under 6 months of age on the day of the show are not eligible to enter for competition. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 4 calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their full details recorded on the entry form.
- A car parking ticket, obtainable from the Secretary on arrival must be displayed on the vehicle. Failure to do so will encounter a parking fine levied by the Park Authorities for which Eastleigh & District DTC cannot be held responsible.
- The mating of bitches on the showground is forbidden.
- Bitches in season may not compete.
- A dog will be disqualified and must be removed from the showground if it is:
 - a bitch in season;
 - suffering from an infectious or contagious disease;
 - interfering with the safety or chance of

winning of an opponent; d. of such temperament or so much out of hand that it is a danger to the safety of any person or other animal; e. likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.

- No person may carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time on the showground.
- The Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge if any judge is unable to fulfil his appointment.
- No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge.
- After a dog has commenced competing in a Class, no substitution of handler is permitted in that class.
- Under no circumstances can a dog be transferred from one class to another unless an error has occurred on the part of the printer or the Show Management.
- Should circumstances require it, the Committee, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. These changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
- The maximum number of entries allowed in any class is 60. If the entry received exceeds 60, except in Championship Class C, the class will be equally divided (to within one dog) by a draw. If the resulting individual class entry, after division, exceeds 60 a further division of the total class entry shall take place so that each equal division of the class is 60 or less. In all classes, other than Championship Class C, if the entry received exceeds 50 the class may, at the discretion of the Society, be equally divided by a draw (to within one dog). If the resulting individual class entry, after division, exceed 50 a further division of the total entry may take place so that each equal division of the class is 50 or less. Prize money for each division (which must be judged separately) shall be the same as that offered for the original class.
- Where classes are divided, competitors therein shall be notified of all changes and times stay exercises must not be held earlier than advertised for the original class.
- Where the entry for Championship Class C exceeds 60, it will be reduced to 60 by a ballot based on a system of merit, conducted by the Kennel Club. Competitors will receive their order of running in Championship Class C or will be advised of their failure to obtain a place in the ballot for the Class, prior to the Show. It is most important that competitors in Championship Class C state the number of merit points on their entry form. To calculate the merit score for the dog, points are allocated for places gained at previous shows on the following scale:-

Crufts Obedience	30 points	18 points	12 points	6 points
- Points are calculated for placings between the date to which previous wins are calculated for entry to the Show (Monday 19th May 2008) and the same date one year earlier. Competitors not giving a merit score will be considered as having none. The merit score for all competitors in Championship classes C will be on display at the Show. Competitors claiming an incorrect merit score will be reported to the Committee of the Kennel Club for action.
- Ballot for Running Orders
 - A draw for the running order in Championship Class C must be made prior to the Show. The Kennel Club will conduct the ballot for this running order and Show Secretaries must forward the names of the exhibitors and dogs involved, together with their merit scores, to the Kennel Club by recorded delivery or registered post within seven days of the closing of entries.
 - Where the draw makes provision for reserve competitors they should not be substituted before 12noon on the day of the Show. Reserve competitors in attendance at the Show and excluded from the final running order shall receive a refund of their entry fee for the class.
 - Where a draw for the complete running order of Classes other than Championship Class C is not made, Show Management must conduct a ballot to determine a running order for at least the first 10 competitors/dogs in these classes: this may be reduced to 6 at shows with less than 200 dogs entered or where there are less than 25 dogs entered in a specific class.
 - In classes where a complete or partial running order has been made, the relevant competitors must be notified before the day of the Show.
 - In classes where there is not a full running order all competitors must personally report to the ringside of all classes entered and book in, by marking a list of entries, within one hour of the scheduled time for the commencement of judging of the Class. In classes where a full running order has been made competitors must book in on arrival at the Show. The class lists are to be provided by the Show Management and should be available for the stated opening time of the Show. Wherever possible Ring Scoreboard Stewards shall be appointed to assist with this booking in procedure.
 - All published running order must be strictly observed. Competitors reporting late will be excluded from competition unless they have previously reported to the Chief Steward that they are actually working a dog in Championship Class C or in the Stay test of another class.
- Where timed stays will take place it must be announced in the schedule that they will take priority over other tests, the times of such tests to be published at the show and in the catalogue. In the case of Championship Class C, stays must not be judged before 12.00noon. In all other cases, timed stays must not commence before one hour after the published time for commencement of judging.
- For the duration of the Show, and including those in the exercise area, all dogs must be on a lead except when competing or practising prior to competition.
- No dog shall be allowed in the judging ring other than those competing in the class being judged.
- After the commencement of judging the responsibility for dogs being brought to the ring to compete is entirely the competitors.
- Any dog which is not presented for stay or scent exercises when called for testing shall be considered to have withdrawn from the class.
