**Minutes of the Meeting Dated Monday 18<sup>th</sup> September 2006**  
**Held @ Denbury Village Hall – 7.30pm**

**Present** – Mr B Clatworthy (Chairman), Mrs J Loynes, Dr S Hickey, Mr R Birch.

**Apologies** – None received.

**Attended by** – No Public Present.

- 1) Minutes of the last meeting dated Monday 12<sup>th</sup> June 2006 have been distributed and read. Proposed by Mrs J Loynes and seconded by Mr R Birch. They were duly signed by the Chairman – Mr B Clatworthy.
- 2) **Correspondence.**
  - a) Various Play Equipment Leaflets.
  - b) The Playing Field Newsletter Summer 2006 & Annual Report – Given to Mrs J Loynes for perusal.
  - c) Letter from Devon & Cornwall Constabulary – This was to report the incident when the dug out was damaged – this has now been repaired, but a crime number has been logged.
  - d) Letter from TDC – Rubbish Bin Collection – They have confirmed that they will not collect from the site, but this matter has now been addressed by Denbury AFC.
- 3) **Matters Arising.**
  - a) Childrens Play Area Fencing – This has now been completed by Graham Williams – a very good job, half his bill has been paid and the rest to be paid shortly when the Rural Aid Grant has been claimed.
  - b) Renewal of Licence on Field to Denbury AFC – This has now been signed with copies held by the Parish Council and Denbury AFC.
  - c) Flooding in Road and installation of a soakaway – John Williams DCC – The Clerk to contact and ask when the works are due to take place.
  - d) Outstanding Rent from Newton Town FC – This has now been paid.
- 4) **Report from Denbury AFC** – Mr Rob Birch reported that the season has now started. The outside of the changing rooms have been painted and the broken dugout repaired. Some rubbish has been left around after matches, this problem has been addressed it will be bagged up and taken away by a football club member who has a car trailer. Works are ongoing, the sign is not yet up but its in the process of being done. The vandalism has stopped at present but the door that was smashed has been repaired. The Grass is being cut on a permanent basis. Fences have been painted. The field is full at weekends when being used by teams and on Sundays when the carpark is full up they have been given permission to use the gunclub behind for extra parking.
- 5) **Cricket Club Report** – Dr S Hickey reported – The season finished yesterday and we have won more than lost this year. The pitch has played well and needs some work in the Autumn, the moss being a major problem. This will be attended to and re-seeded, then fenced to keep people and animals off. The hut painting will be finished off. A quote for the cricket net was quite expensive more funds are needed before it can go ahead. Winter Social evenings will be organised and the nets start in February 2007 in readiness for the new season. The Clerk will look into a Rural Aid Small Grant to raise the extra funds needed for the Cricket Net base.
