

**The will of George Bunniard or Bunyard of Lewes,
Sussex, 1646**

In the name of God Amen

the ffifth day of March in the yeare of our Lord God one thousand six hundred fforty and six I George Bunniard of Lewes in the County of Sussex Clerk being sicke in body but of good and perfect Remembrance thankes be to god for Itt doe make and ordayne this my last will and testament in manner and forme following ffirst I bequeath my Soul to Almighty God my maker and Saviour and my body to the earth from whence itt came. Item I give to Martha Bunniard my Daughter tenn poundes of lawfull money of England. Item more I give to my sayd Daughter my watch all the Rest of my Goodes, my debtes being payd and my body being buryed I give and bequeath wholly to Elizabeth Bunnierd my lovinge wyfe whom I make sole and whole executrix of this my last will and testament. And I ordaine and make my Cozen Materss... of Lewes Overseer of this my will In witness that this is my trew and last Will I the herein named George Bunniard have hereunto subscribed my name George Bunyard in the presence of Thomas Pateresson XX Nicholas

The will was proved at London on 20th May 1647 before Sir Nathaniel Brent
