- Class 1 Clear round cross poles at maximum of 50cm (assistance permitted)
(horse/rider combo not to have been placed in any open SJ comp)
- Class 2 60cm height class(maximum height in first round)
(horse/rider combo not to have been placed in any open SJ comp)
- Class 3 70cm height class (maximum height in first round)
(horse/rider combo not to have been placed in any 80cm comp or have any BSJA winnings)
- Class 4 80cm height class (maximum height in first round)
(horse/rider combo not to have been placed in any 85cm comp or have any BSJA winnings)
- Class 5 85cm height class (maximum height in first round)
(horse/rider combo not to have been placed in any 90cm comp or have have won more than £25 BSJA)
- Class 6 90cm height class (maximum height in first round)
(horse/rider combo not to have won more than £100 BSJA or have more than 10 BE points)
- Class 7 1m height class (maximum height in first round)
(horse/rider combo not to have competed in classes 1, 2 or 3)
- Class 8 1.10m height class (maximum height in first round)
(horse/rider combo not to have competed in classes 1, 2 or 3)

Rules and Regulations

1. Entries will only be accepted on the day.
2. The organisers have the right to alter/amalgamate/cancel classes.
3. The organisers have to the right to decline any entry and to ask any entry combination thought to be completing in the wrong height class to complete HC or move up a class.
4. All classes will be one show jumping round, followed by a jump off against the clock if there is equality for first place after the first round (as in BSJA Table A7). The distance of tracks for all classes from class 3 onwards will be set based on horse/ponies travelling at a speed of 325 metres per minute.
5. Classes will be judged in accordance to BRC rules and will apply with regard to all general points such as permitted saddlery and dress.
6. Parent/guardians should specify if they do not wish their child to be photographed in relation to NERC (Scotland).
7. Competitors **may not** use the outside school to lunge their horses on the day of competition.
8. In order to avoid congestion during busy classes, competitors may not warm up in the outside school unless their class is underway or is beginning soon.
9. Competitors are required to show courtesy towards others when warming up in the outside school. Competitors should pass left to left and practice jumps should be jumped with in the correct direction- the side of the fence marked "red" should be kept on the rider's right.

Health and Safety

10. The Organiser has overall responsibility for Health and Safety.
11. The event is organised in accordance with Health and Safety legislation and all who have (to any extent) control of premises or site at the event are responsible for ensuring that:
 - a. Everything reasonably practicable is done to ensure the health and safety and welfare of those attending the event.
 - b. They conduct themselves so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk
 - c. Access to and egress from the site is safe
12. Emergencies
 - a. Emergency services must have access to all parts of the event site at all times and members of the public must not park vehicles so as to obstruct access.
 - b. First aid points are clearly marked

- c. In the case of an emergency, members of the public should contact the nearest official or dial 999 on the nearest telephone. A mobile phone is located in the secretary's office.
 - d. In the event that emergency medical treatment requires to be administered, competitors, parents/guardians should inform the organisers of any pre-existing medical conditions which require specific treatment/medication.
13. Horses can be easily frightened and can be dangerous. Members of the public are requested to keep clear from horse areas/lanes and to avoid behaviour that might frighten horses.
 14. All riders must wear a hard hat to at least the minimum standard with a harness properly adjusted and fastened. Hats should be marked EN1384, PAS015, ASTM F1163, BSEN14572 or SEI. Riders are expected to behave in a responsible manner at all times or they face elimination.
 15. The wearing of body protectors is **compulsory for those under 12 years of age** and highly recommended for all others. In the interest of safety competitors should also ensure that long hair is secured appropriately.
 16. Dogs must be kept on a lead and under close control at all times.
 17. The making of an entry implies acceptance of the conditions listed above.
